Katía Truijen (1990) is a media researcher and musician based in Rotterdam. Since 2014, she has been developing research projects and public programs within Het Nieuwe Instituut's Research department. Her current research focuses on the politics of contemporary video culture (*For the Record*) and ecologies of sound (*Tuning-In*). She was assistant curator for *Work, Body, Leisure*, the Dutch Pavilion at the 16th Venice International Architecture Biennale (2018), and co-editor of *Architecture of Appropriation: On Squatting as Spatial Practice* (2019) and *For the Record: On the Politics of Music Video* (2021).

Katía has published about digital culture, artistic research, design and architecture for among others Sonic Acts, Museum Boijmans Van Beuningen / Design Column, Virtueel Platform, Institute of Network Cultures, IDFA DocLab, WhyNot and FIBER. She graduated from the MA in New Media and Digital Cultures at the University of Amsterdam with the thesis *Urban Dialogues* and completed the Art & Research Honours Programme at the Gerrit Rietveld Academie.

Previously, she taught at the University of Amsterdam, department of Media Studies, was a guest lecturer at the Vrije Universiteit Amsterdam, Design Academy Eindhoven, ArtEZ University of the Arts, de Nederlandse Filmacademie, the 25th International Philosophy Olympiad, the iMAL Urban Media Lab Symposium Brussels, and visiting critic at The Berlage Institute and the Architectural Association School of Architecture. In 2021-2022 she lectures about the space in-between dance and architecture following the publication *Moving Through the Middle*, as part of the dance performance and installation *Interval* by Amos Ben-Tal and Gosse de Kort.

As a curator and cultural programmer, Katía co-curated the Urban Summer festival (2021) and Archiweek (2020) titled *Fundamental Acts* together with Traumnovelle and humbble commissioned by Urban Brussels, as well as self-initiated festivals *So it Goes* (2019), *Club Voyage* (2015), *Frisse Moed* (2012), *Het Verval* (2012), and the exhibition *Souvenirs* at Felix Meritis in Amsterdam (Gevonden Voorwerpen, 2015). Together with Sjaak Douma (Analogue Dear) she is co-founder of the online magazine for art and music */\ hoekhuis*.

As a musician, Katía released a series of records with band members Denis Wouters, Jelle Himmelreich, Zoli Soos, Viktor Truijen, and many collaborating musicians between 2011-2014. She joined Port of Call, led by Pieter van Vliet in 2018. Katía's latest record *Room to Stay* (produced with Mart Jeninga) was launched in July 2020.
